

## The story of the

### Odeon

Cinema historian Jeremy Buck visited members of the Muswell Hill and Fortis Green Association to tell them the secret history of the Muswell Hill Odeon. He covered everything from the Pathe newsreel of the opening night on 9 September 1936 right through to the present day rebirth as the Everyman.

Along the way some highlights were the photographs of the old Athenaeum cinema (now Sainsburys on the opposite side of the road) and a detailed analysis of how the interior of the Odeon building has changed over time. The association itself also got a mention, having successfully led the campaign for the cinema building to be given Listed status when it was under threat of closure in the 1980s.

Jeremy pointed out that although many current and former cinemas in London are listed buildings, the Muswell Hill Everyman is one of just two Grade II\* Listed buildings still operating as cinemas, and therefore is of particular significance. The Phoenix in East Finchley, of course, is also Grade II Listed (but with no 'star').
