# The power of nature changed my world

Artist Denise Wyllie, who lives in Long Lane, N2, wanted to throw herself out of her comfort zone and find new inspiration so she bought a ticket to Japan and travelled solo to the land of cherry blossom. Here she describes how it changed her art.

I got rained on for three weeks trying to paint cherry blossom. I felt the power of nature so strongly I couldn't help but take a bow to it. Rain washed away my sorrows and gave me strength.

In October I had an exhibition in the Sugino Gallery, Ginza, the stylish area of Tokyo. There was rain and more rain and something new to me: typhoons.

On my way there I stopped off to see Yoshihisa Shida, an expert photographer of Mount Fuji. I was up at 4am, driving up scary dark, steep, narrow roads into the mountains with cameras and tripods. The rain suddenly cleared for the first sunny day in weeks and majestic Fuji was in full view.

I saw a secret hidden temple high in the mountains where monks still live a life of quiet solitude. I also revisited a family of friendly tea farmers at their beautiful traditional home, decorated with kimonos and ancient framed letters of thanks from the Emperor and Prime Minister for their tea.

### Climbing high

Even though I had planned my trip daily, with a heavy schedule ahead, the power of nature made me stop and rethink my journey. The temples and the mountain were symbolic. I had to climb high in order to get a better view of my life and career.

My mixed media prints from a series called 'The Cherry Blossom Front' are inspired by my first experience of Japan. Rain gave me a refreshed focus. All I needed to do was trust in nature.
