# Developer puts plans on hold

"We will continue to relocate the nursery to Langley House, further up the High Road where I have now signed a lease," said Paula. "The future of the Park House site is up in the air and Langley House, which we are renovating now to meet our needs, is a marvellous space. "I was lucky to get it as two nursery chains were after it as well and putting in higher offers. It remains to be seen how many years will go by before a building on the Park House site is ready for us. Ultimately we hope to return, but we must have a secure space for the nursery children for as long as necessary".

At the time of going to press she was still in dialogue with Barnet Council regarding her request for an extension to stay until the end of September 2026. Parents of children at

the nursery are urging Barnet Council to confirm the extension, saying youngsters will be severely disrupted without it. They are also questioning the way Places for Barnet have handled the planning application process. See their full letter to The Archer on page 11.

Meanwhile, in another strand to this saga, The Friends of Manor Park Road finally received a formal answer to a question they submitted on 11 July to Councillor Ross Houston, Barnet Council's Deputy Leader and Portfolio Holder for Homes & Regeneration. They had asked who were the other developers who were considered and on what basis were Kuropatwa considered to be the better partner option. Councillor Houston's response revealed that The Hill Group as well as Kuropatwa (now renamed as London Placemaking Group) were invited

to submit proposals. Calendar records show that meetings with both took place in November 2022 when they gave presentations to the council's Director of Growth, but they cannot find any files or information as to how they came to a decision. The letter states the two lead staff who attended that presentation have left the council and concludes: "We recognise we have not met the standards we would expect in terms of record keeping and have taken steps to ensure that this does not happen in the future."

Turning back to Cherry Tree Quarter, Monkey Puzzle owner Paula Murphy is convinced that the longer-term commitment to keeping a nursery on the Park House site, however it is developed, will be honoured, and this has been confirmed to The Archer by Places for Barnet spokesman Marcello Burbante.

It also has the backing of local MP Sarah Sackman, who told *The Archer*: "My priority has always been the needs of the children at the Monkey Puzzle nursery and ensuring that any development that comes forward on the site serves the needs of our East Finchley community for the long term. "Developments need to happen, that is a fact of life given the housing crisis in London, but we must mitigate the impact on the children and the wider community. As your MP, I am not the decision maker on developments, but I am pushing for more family homes that respect the local environment and it's why I have campaigned throughout for a guarantee that a new nursery will be built on the site. We have secured that and must hold developers to account."
